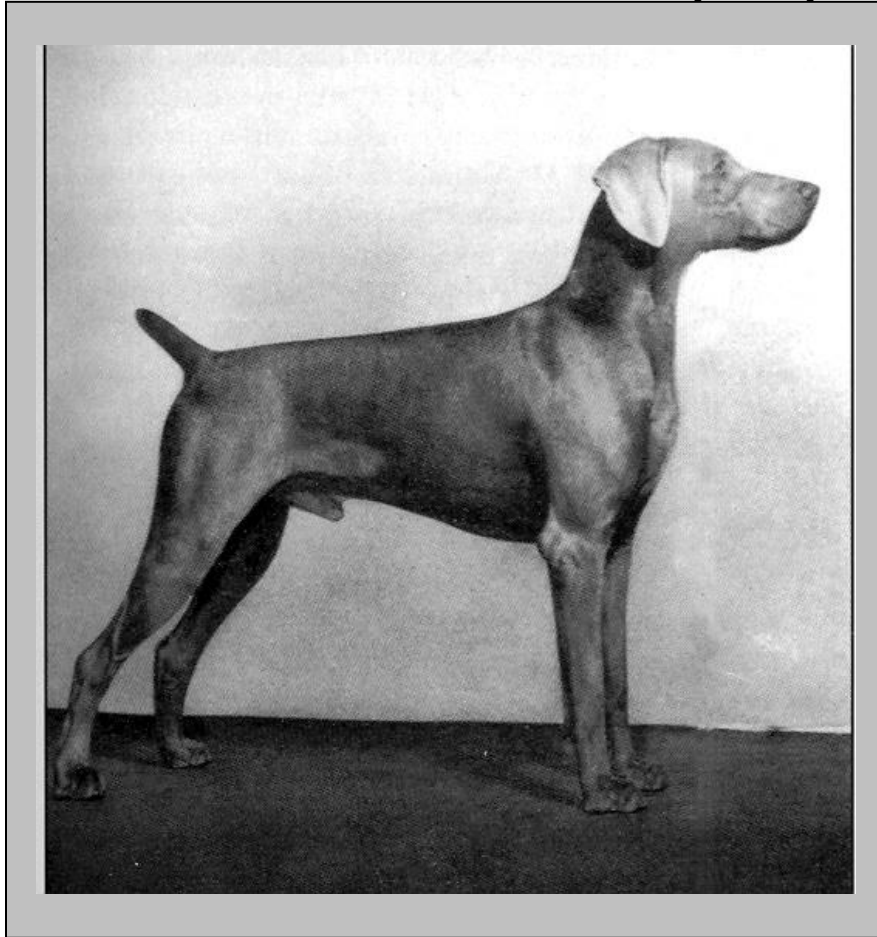

“Duffy” was a hard running and consistent field dog. His style and intensity handling birds was a joy to watch. Handled by professional Ken Jellings, he was entered in 161 field trials, placing 112 times and winning 71 times. He earned his AKC Field Championship in 1976 and his AKC Amateur Championship in 1977. He was the number one WCA Puppy-Derby in 1974 and 1975. He was also the WCA number one All-Age Dog in 1977, '78, '80 and '81. Winning back-to-back Amateur National Championships in 1978 and 1979 and the National Championship in 1978 were a highlight to his career. He was the Weimaraner representative at the AKC Centennial Dog Show in 1984. He sired the 1980 National Derby and Futurity winner and other field placing offspring. He was viewed by many to be one of the best Weimaraner field dogs ever.

In the early 1950's, Ch Anne's Rickey Boy and Ann Kepler became the breed's first owner handler team. Their extensive travels set a new precedent, and they even went north of the border for a Canadian championship. In those days of benched shows, Rickey and Ann were goodwill ambassadors for the breed.

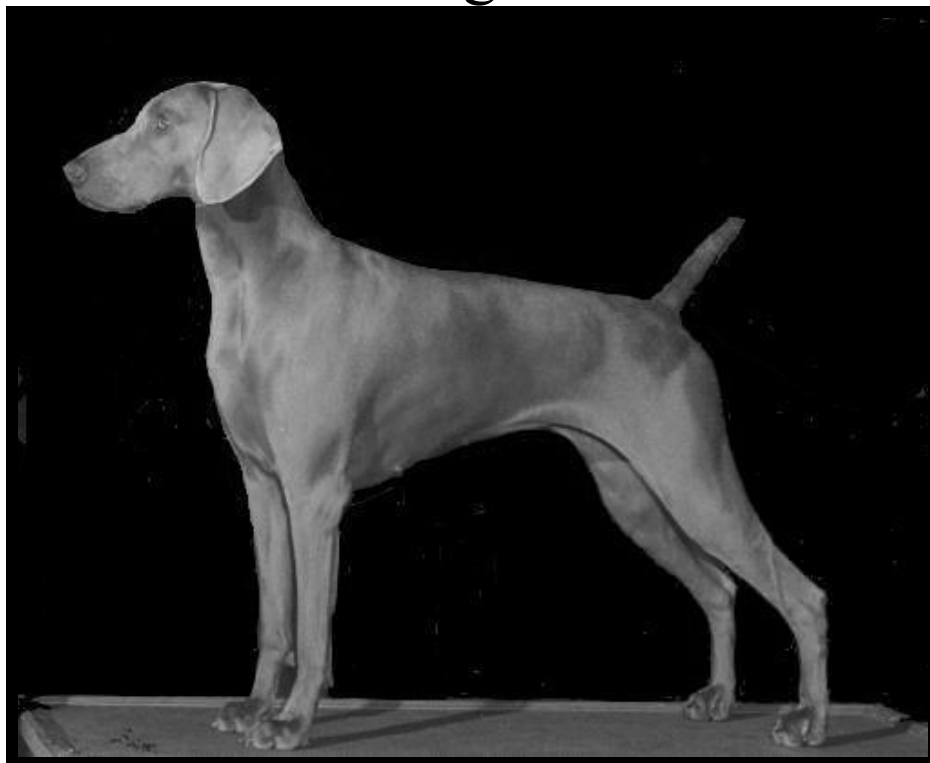
His show record is amazing in itself (155 BOB; 116 Group Placements, including 16 first and 37 seconds; two Best Am. Bred in Show; one Best in Show; and 35 Specialty wins). Rick would be considered a great dog on the strength of this record alone. However, it is in the stud department that Rick really left his mark. As of now, he is the sire of 26 Champions, with several others who will surely finish soon. He is the sire of two Group winners. The number of champions in whose pedigrees he appears in impossible to calculate, but their legions include BIS Am.& Can. Ch. Shadowmar Barthaus Dorilio, and the winning Champions, Gronback's Aladdin and Kebbena's Rudolf of Bear Creek.

In a little over 18 mths she made breed history by breaking all records with 27 Best In Shows.

He was the Sire of 17 Junior Hunters, 2 Senior Hunters, 6 Obedience Title holders and 7 Futurity/Maturity winners.

His Get have been Top Ten, Group Winners, Multiple Best in Sweepstakes Winners, Multiple Best in Specialty Winners, Group Winners, Best in Futurity/Best in Maturity and Top Producing Sires/Dams and BROM's.

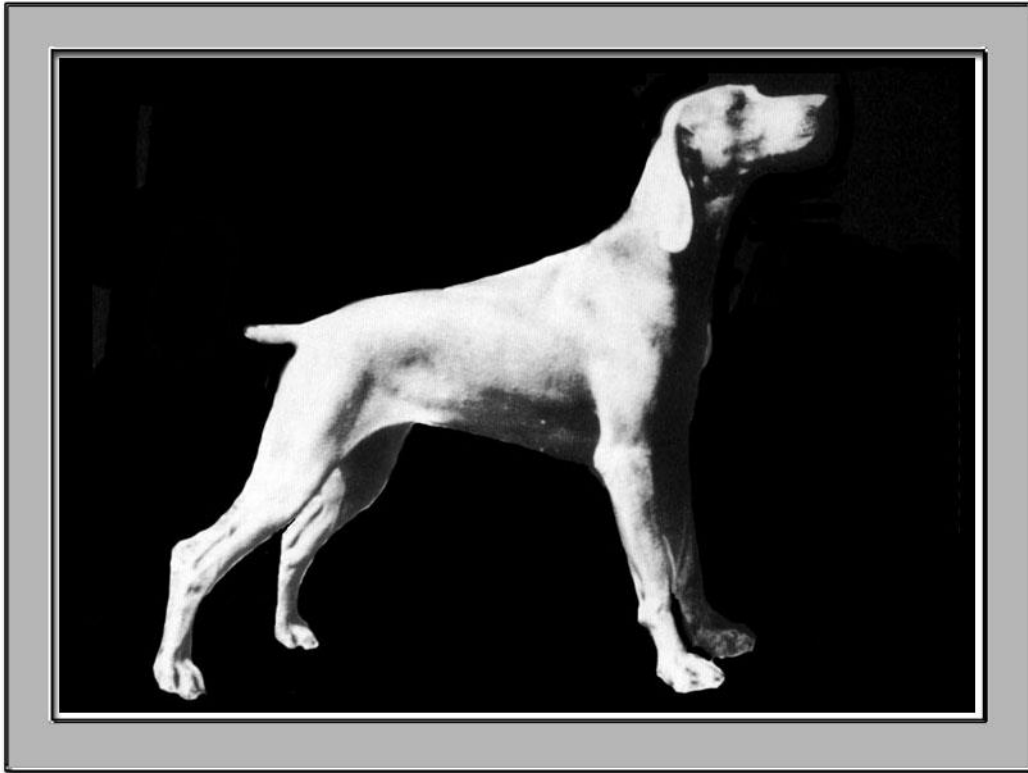

Bella, a German import, is best known as the foundation of the Reiteralm line. Her German heritage of hunting talent, structural soundness and trainable temperament has been a priceless contribution to the quality of the modern Weimaraner. She is in the pedigrees of 70 percent of the futurity and maturity winners from 1982 to 1990.

She is probably best known through her BROM son Ch. Maximillian v. d. Reiteralm NSD, whose sixty-two champions stood as a breed record until broken by his own son, Rajah.

Bella is also the granddam of three dual champions, including one that won four national field championship stakes.

A member of the fabled HARRISBURG "B" litter and, quite simply, one of the greatest Weimaraners who ever lived. Amateur handled in the ring by his owner, Elvin Deal, with whom he is pictured, he became a champion in seven shows including winners dog at Westminster when he was 11 months old. Trained and handled by Chet Cummings, he was the first Weim to win an Open-All-Age stake against Pointers and Setters and was named to the 1955 Sports Afield All-American Team. He has 17 Field Trial victories and ran in his last Pointer-Setter trial at 11 years of age, placing third. He was the sire of 21 Champions including the first dog to be Best In Show in the United States and he was also the sire of the National Open and national Amateur All Age Champion in 1953.

Always a gentleman in whatever he did, Konsul excelled in the breed ring, achieved an all-breed High in Trial, and was a Top Producer. Most of all, he was a loyal companion his entire life. Bred very sparingly, he was the sire of 19 champions, including Top Producers, Ch. Bing's Razzmatazz von Konsul, CD, BROM, sire of 62 champions, Ch. Bing's Galactica von Konsul, CDX, NSD, NRD, V, BROM, dam of 15 champions, and Ch. Bing's Picante von Konsul, CD, BROM, dam of 10 champions.

My favorite story about Konsul occurred as I stood at ringside holding another breed. A man walked up to me and asked if I was the person who showed a Weimaraner in obedience that morning. When I told him that I had, he said how much he enjoyed watching him work and how good he thought he was. He said he couldn't believe every time the judge said exercise finished, the dog would roll his eyes up to the top of his head. He said he felt this dog should have won High in Trial, as he thought he worked the best of any dog he saw that day! I had the privilege of telling him that he had, indeed, gone High in Trial!

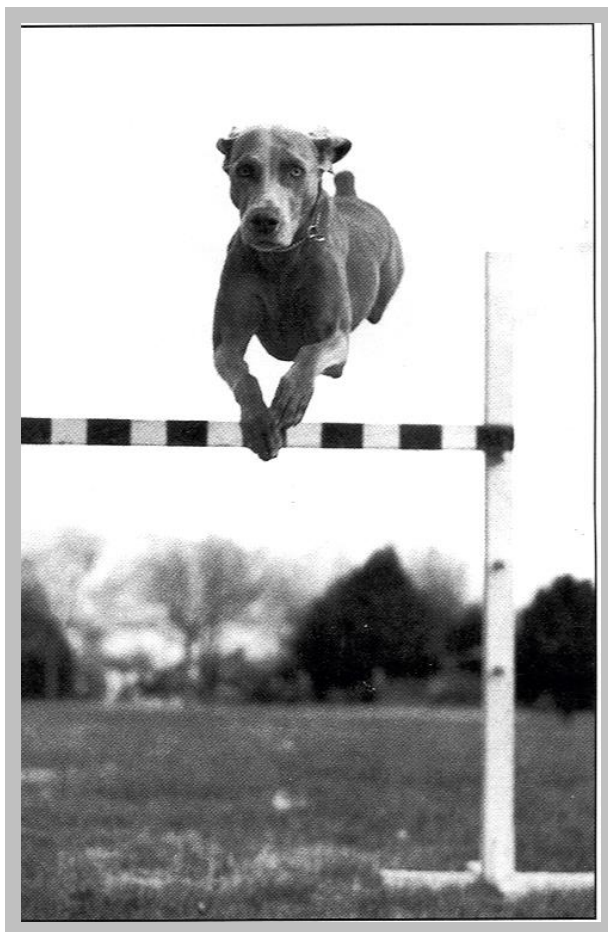

Pure Grafmar in breeding and pure bird-dog in performance, Bitsu was known as "The Outlaw" because of his stubborn and willful temperament. His first owners were unable to handle him and place this "free spirit" with Joe Lipop who sent him to Chet Cummings for Field training. In 1951 and 1952, Chet and Bitsu won the WCA National Open All Age. He became one of the breed's most famous trial dogs and proved to be an excellent sire as well. Among his get was Crested Glade Warrior, the first Weimaraner to win the National German Pointing Dog Championship.

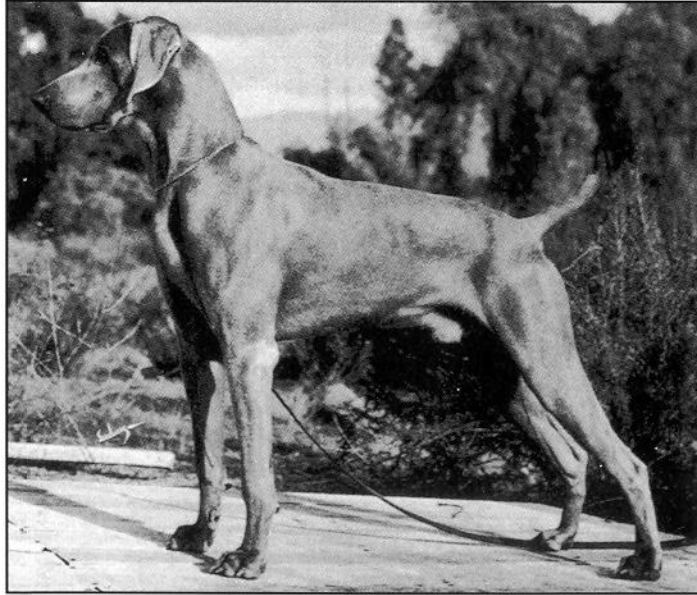

Samantha's achievements are awesome: she is the first Weimaraner to earn an obedience championship, she is the first to hold all AKC obedience and tracking titles plus all WCA ratings, and she ranked on the top-ten obedience lists from 1976 to 1981. Samantha won high in trial and high-combined in trial four times. After finishing the obedience championship, Samantha retired to do the things she really considered fun and earned additional titles-TDX, NSD, SD SDX, and RDX.

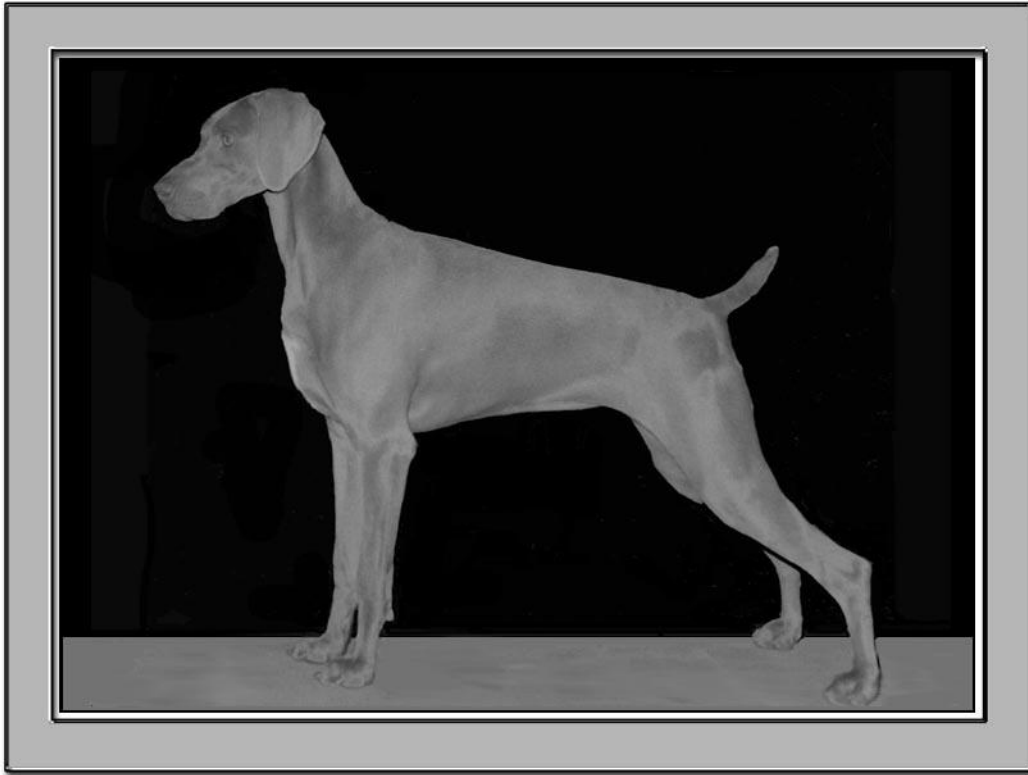

Birdy and intense, he hunted with his master, retrieving birds from the water in the Alaskan snow. Gentle and obedient with his owners and friendly with strangers, he was never aggressive with man or dog, but protective and willing to back it up if needed. An excellent sire, he produced 19 champions, some outstanding field performers and was the grandsire of Best-In-Show Ch. Graves' Rogue.

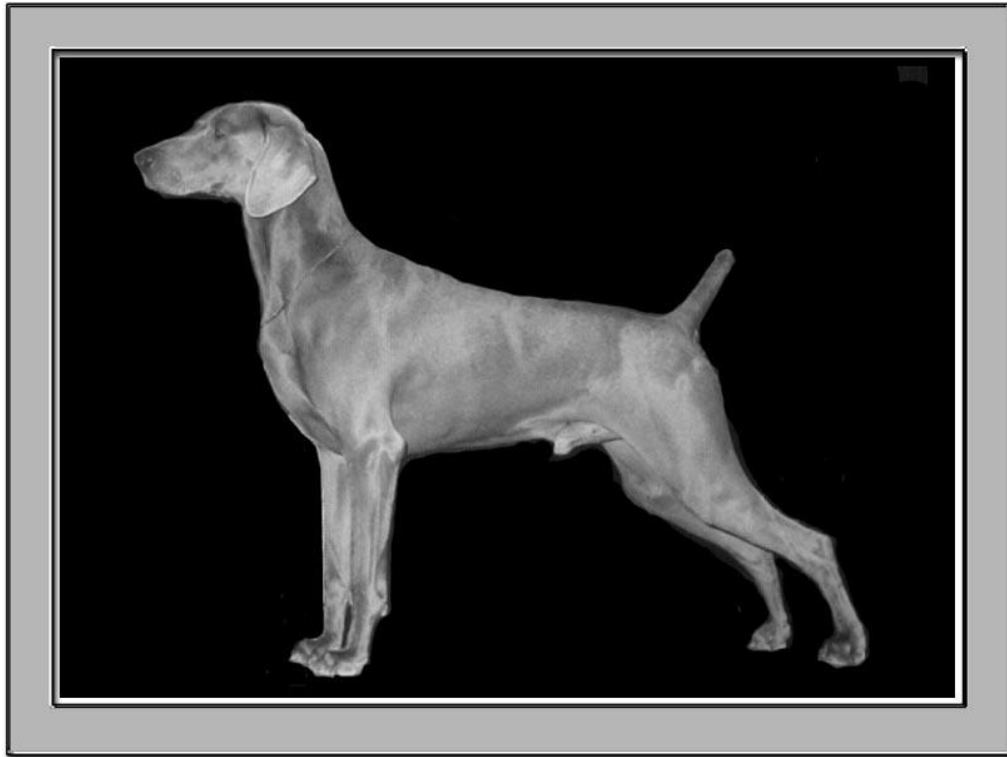
Jack's real contribution to the breed was his ability as a sire. Sire of 54 champions he is the #5 BROM top producer. An amazing 20 percent of his champions are themselves BROM top producers. His offspring include: 1 BIS winner, 12 Futurity/Maturity winners, 12 obedience title holders, 9 hunt test title holders and 11 BROM top producers.

In addition to his American Offspring, his frozen semen was used in Australia for one litter. That litter produced 5 BIS winners which include the all time top winning Weimaraner in Australia who was a multiple BIS winner and BIS at the Sydney Royal, the Westminster of Australia over an entry of more than 5000 dogs.

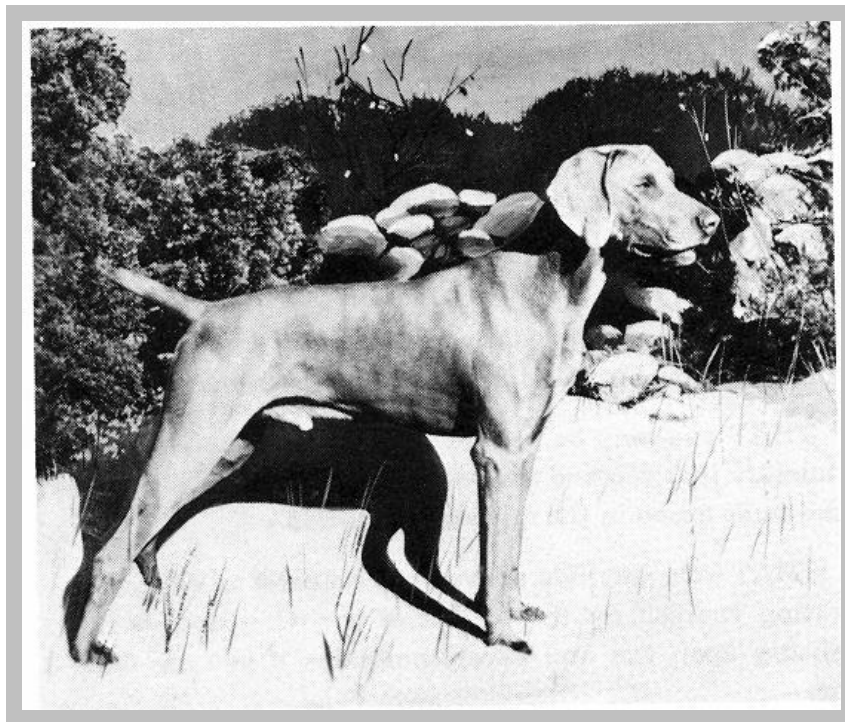

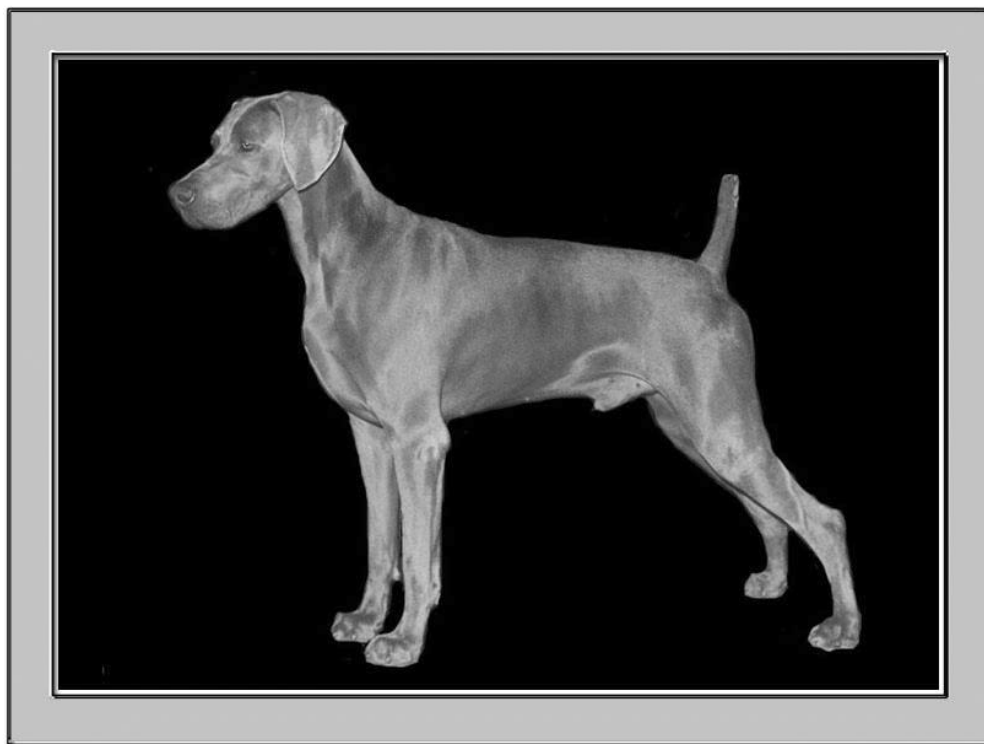

“Ri” was imported from Austria at age two. He went on to finish his Bench Championship easily in the United States, but his greatness came from his hunting ability. At the time of his death American Field gave these statistics: of the Top 24 outstanding Weimaraner studs in America, seven of them are Dido and his offspring. Ri has 84 recorded progeny wins and has sired 19 winners. Of the total recorded progeny wins of 980 for the 24 dogs, 408 are Ri’s and his offspring, which is 42% of the total.

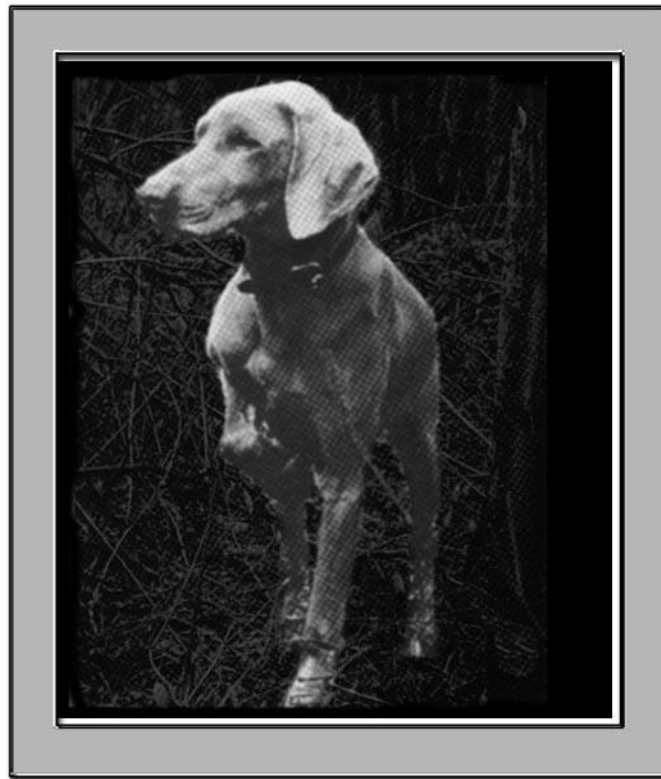
Daunt's impact as a sire is still felt today. He is behind a majority of today's top winning and top producing sires and dams. He was the sire of 52 champions which included 2 Best In Show winners and 3 Futurity winners. The best evidence of his influence on the breed is his 17 BROM progeny (almost 1/3 of his champions).

Daunt produced sons that could produce but the ability of his daughters to produce is unmatched to this day. He is the sire of 11 BROM bitches, more than any other sire.

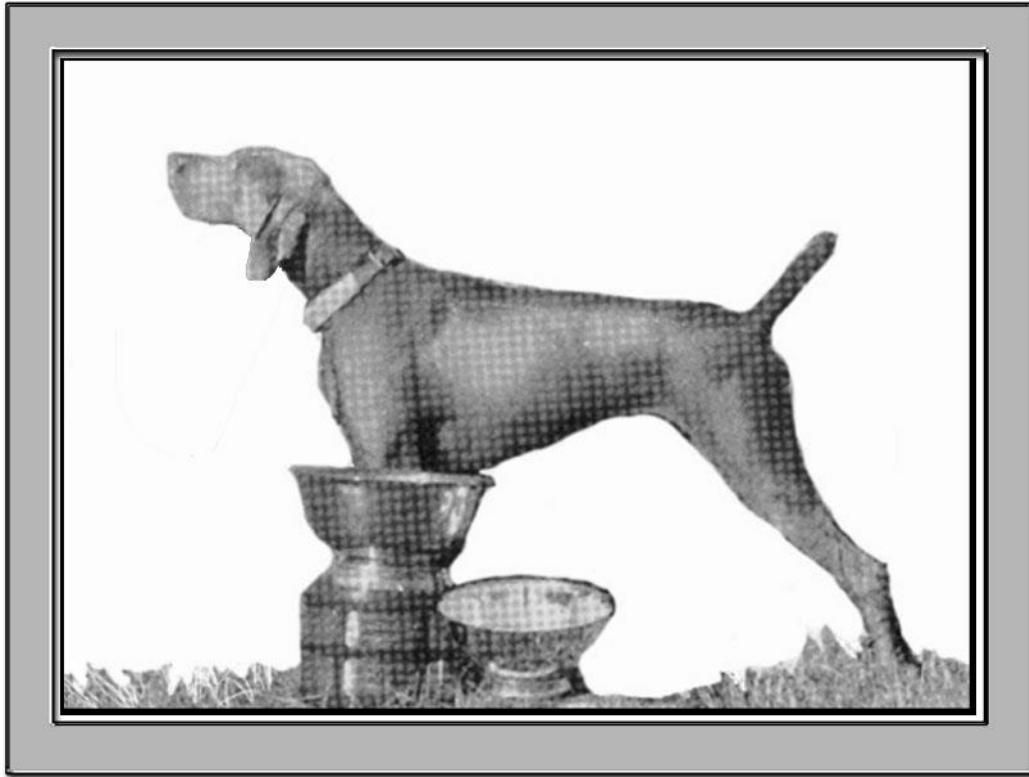

Considered by many to be the greatest Weimaraner Field trial Dog of all time, big, hard running, side ranging, Fritz was famed for his style and intensity. Handled by Chet Cummings, Fritz gained his AKC Field Championship in three Pointer-Setter trials. He scored 84 Field Trial placements in his career including 49 firsts and seven Championships. In 1953 he won the National Open Derby and the National Amateur derby. In 1956 he was the National Open Champion. He was the winner in 1957 and the Champion again in 1961, when nearly ten years of age. He was also named Champion at the Eastern in 1958 and the National Amateur in 1958 and 1960. A producer of both bench and field champions, he was exerted enormous influence on the breed.

Smokey's bench championship included two consecutive 4-point majors. He was exclusively amateur trained and handled. His field career included wins at the Eastern and Mid-Atlantic Classics. He amassed more than 60 wins during a seven year field trial career.

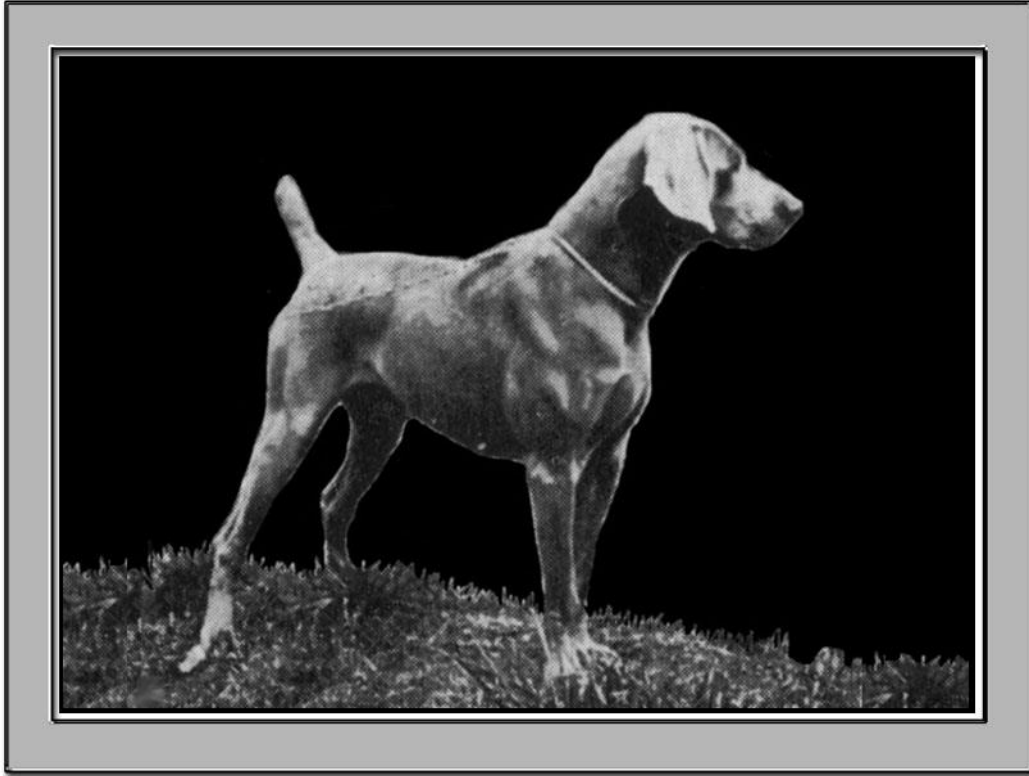

Gerri was twice winner of the National Open Championship (1955 and 1958). He was not campaigned in between these except for 'comeback' trials prior to the 1958 Nationals.

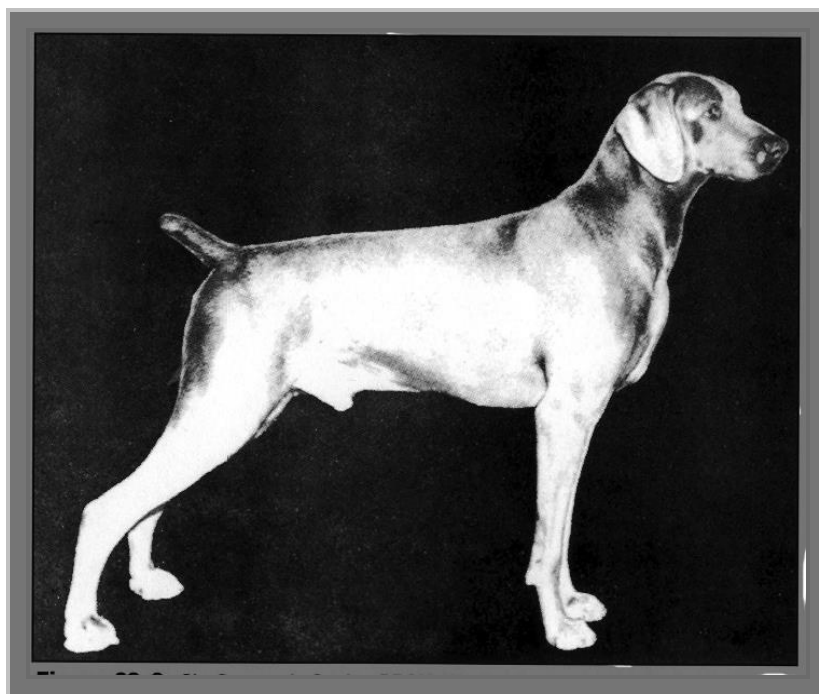
He won the National Amateur Derby in 1954 and the Northern California Open All-Age at 17 months.

CH Gourmat's Sardar became the breed's fifth BIS winner in the late 1950's. Fritz was the smallest puppy of the litter and was sold as a pet. For one reason or another, the home did not work out, nor did the subsequent ones. The third time Frits returned, Erma decided that the dark gray puppy was fated to be her dog, and his fine show career proved the wisdom of her decision.

Handled by Dick Cooper to 115 breed wins, Fritz went on to many group placements as well as 3 American and 2 Canadians BIS wins (1958-1961) He captured the breed at Westminster in 1958 and 1960 (top winning Weimaraner those years) at the Chicago International in 1959, 1960 and 1962 and the 1960 National Specialty. Fritz is a BROM sire of fourteen champions.

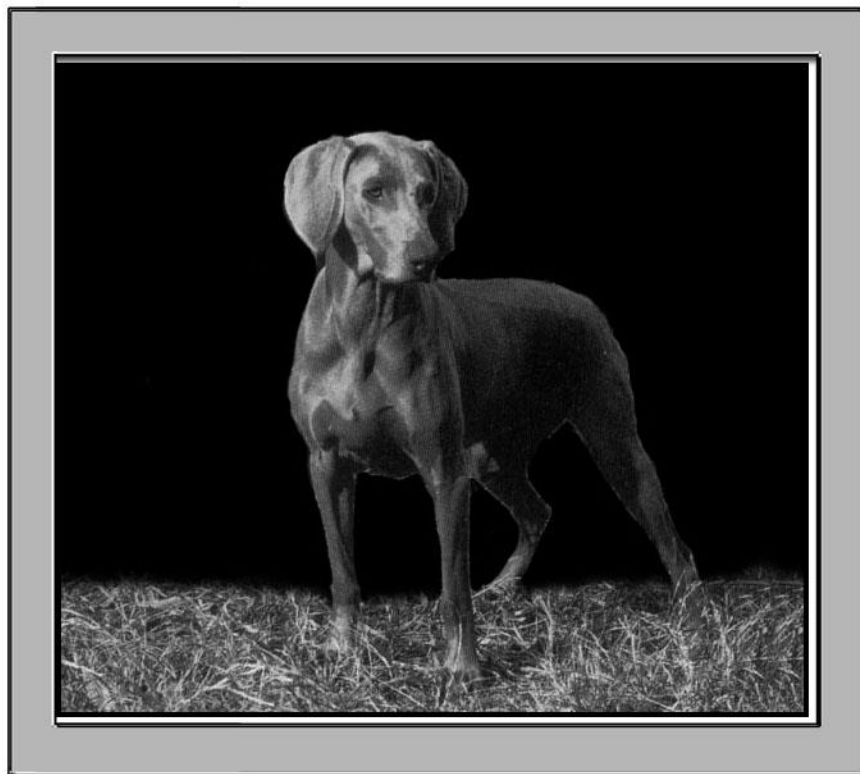

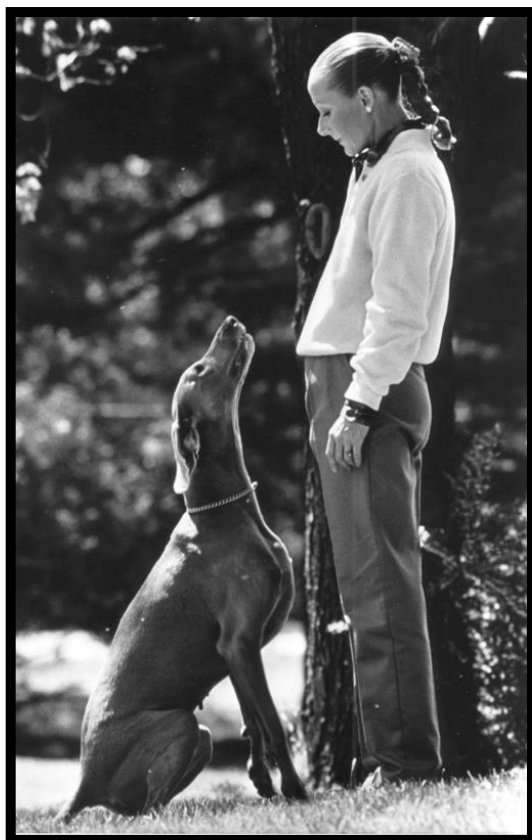

vets, I was told that her dam, Ch. Hoot Hollow's Firefly, CD, TDX, V, was not pregnant. But I knew otherwise. Grace was delivered into my waiting hands on May 9, 1983. Since she was a singleton and delivered by caesarean section, the anesthesia took its toll and I fought 24 hour a day for ten days. I tube fed, stimulated and held her and above all, WILLED her to live!

And LIVE she did! Gracie spent the rest of her days making me HAPPY and PROUD!

She was certified for AKC TD entry at 16 WEEKS of age. She earned her TD in her FIRST test at six months three days. Then on to TDX. She earned her TDX title in her first test at the second National TDX test in Ohio. She was only 18 month old at the time. In her lifetime, Grace followed 48-hour-old tracks with ease, and once found a starter's pistol in a 50-acre corn field because I asked her to.

The obedience titles came easily, too, although Grace found obedience a bit boring. She earned her CD with five straight qualifying scores—all with class placements. Her CDX came in four shows—five months later. Then her UD seven months later in only four attempts. I campaigned her in obedience for two years, and she remained in the Top Ten both years. And, I feel that if Gracie had actually been fully awake during this period, we could've earned an OTCh title! Her average score was about 190.0, so she remained, at least, semi-conscious throughout the whole ordeal!

Her field ratings were more exciting for her. She earned an NSD, NRD, RD, and an RDX all within a year's time.

Gracie excelled in the whelping box as well. In only two litters in two consecutive years, she produced five champions, three CDs, two CDXs, four TDs, four NRDs, four NSDs, one RD, two JHs, one SH, and three Vs. Both of her litters were born on January 20th.

There has not been a day since then that I haven't missed her! She was TRULY an AMAZING dog.

But numbers cannot tell you what she was like. She made you catch your breath, she made your heart stand still and if you ever saw her, you will never forget her.

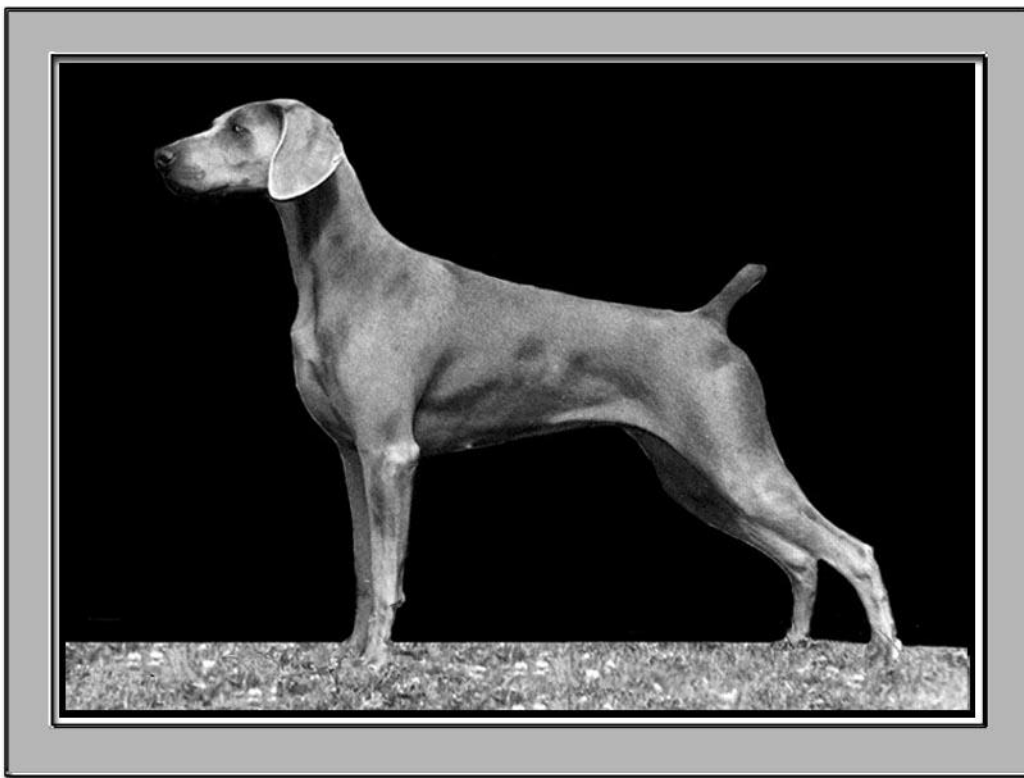

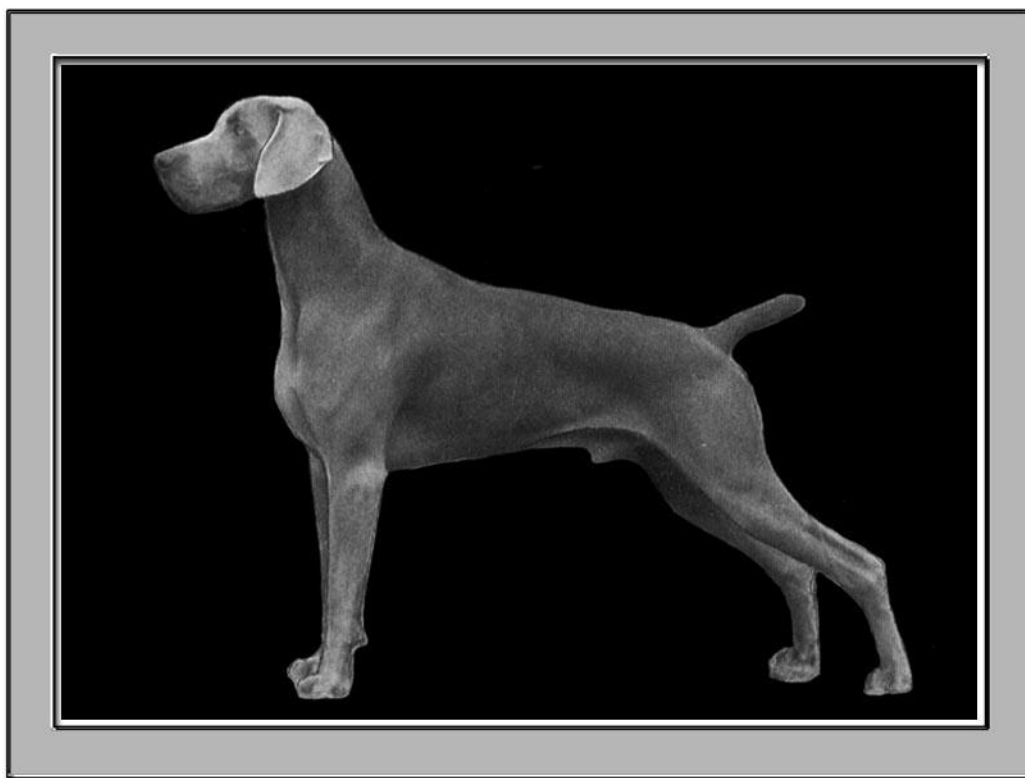

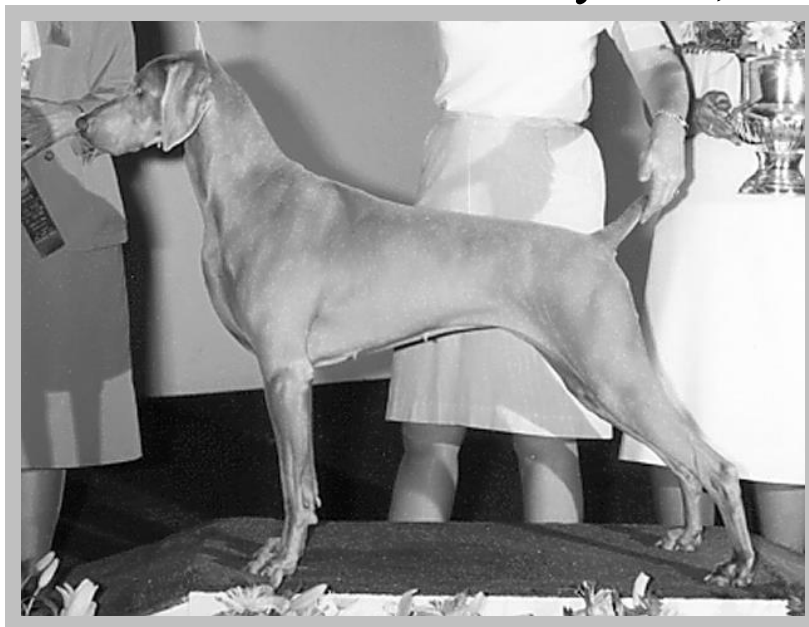

She is the only Weimaraner to be awarded the Dual Championship for earning a show championship and OT championship title in 1992. She then earned her Junior Hunter title in four straight hunt tests. Sparking was also the first Weim to earn a Utility Dog Excellent title. Retired in December, 1994, Sparky was a multiple High in Trial and High Combined winner including the 1994 WCA National Specialty. Sparky was then handled by Junior Handler, Maggie Bonness for a year, earning multiple first places, qualifying Maggie for Westminster and earning Maggie the #1 Weimaraner Junior Handler. At the age of 10, Sparky earned her Novice Agility title in 3 straight trials placing in all 3 trials. Her third leg was First Place at the First WCA Agility Trial in Perry, GA. She also earned her NRD at the same National.

When she wasn't showing on weekends, she was busy showing her skills off as a pet therapy dog. Her gentle nature and love of children made her a natural to move up to children in wheelchairs and place her head in their lap. She often didn't know when to make the distinction and once, after seeing a child watching her work in Utility, left the ring to "do her job". 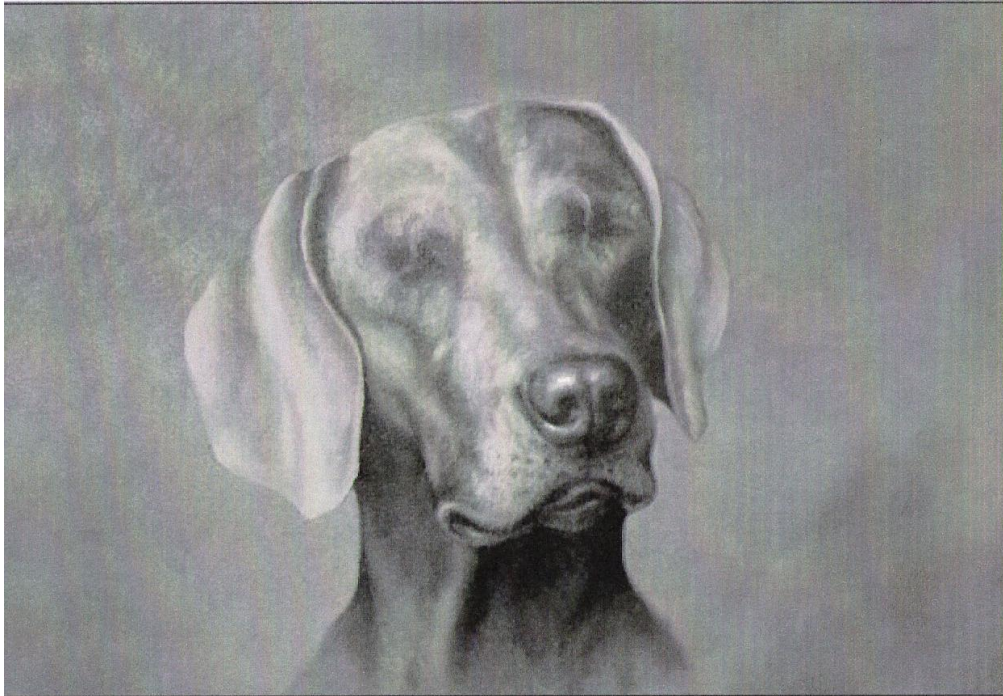

The life story of Earl Worsham's Windy truly exemplifies the depth of selfless love that can exist between a man and his dog. At the age of two, after easily finishing her bench championship and earning her Novice Shooting Dog title, Windy became gravely ill with what would eventually be diagnosed as an advanced case of "blastomycosis", a serious infection caused by a fungal organism present in sandy, acid soils. After enduring weeks of aggressive treatment involving antibiotic therapy and the surgical removal of both eyes, she miraculously recovered to full health. For the rest of her remarkable life, she *insisted* on being "normal".

On August 21, 1988, Earl handled Windy to her Novice Retrieving Rating! On March 18, 1989, after dragging Earl to four successive hunting tests, she earned her Junior Hunter certificate from the American Kennel Club---believed to be the first and only such title ever awarded to an eyeless dog!

Windy died peacefully at her beautiful Tennessee mountaintop home in the arms of her beloved Earl on Sunday afternoon, October 24, 1999 after an apparent heart attack. Earl had just returned from an extended business trip abroad and, clearly, Windy had waited for him so that she could say a proper goodbye; just the way she did things all her life...she insisted!

Annie did almost everything a field dog could do: as witnessed by her titles and her record as a producer of Five Field Champions and two Amateur Field Champions, which is slightly higher than her dams producing record. The record doesn't stop with her immediate get but is still continuing in the succeeding generations. Her grandson, "Jesse" NFC,NAFC,FC,AFC High Ridge Jesse v Horn has been the top ranked field dog in the breed for more years than any other dog and totaled more points yearly than most competitive field champions do in their lifetimes. Another grandson, "Ryder: NFC,FC,AFC, Westend's Lil Sage Rider, is not only a competitor but is rapidly moving up the top producers list.

In her own competitive career, Annie was remarkable for her consistency and longevity. The factor that won her so many ribbons was probably her stylish point, aided by her busy, thorough ground pattern. This was a dog dedicated to the pursuit and pointing of birds and if those who lived with her didn't provide opportunities to do this we knew about it. Her record at the Eastern Classic alone is hard to beat with ten total placements in seven years, including two wins and six placements in the Open Gun Dog Classic.

Moose was a remarkable dog. He was friendly, fearless, alert and obedient just as the standard states. He sired multiple bench champions and performance titled dogs including UD, TDX, MH & VX. He was a Top Ten Obedience dog with multiple Best of Breed wins, and the most titled dog of his time. Moose was also a therapy dog, visiting nursing homes and doing demos for community groups. He had points toward his Amateur Field Championship.

A defining moment came early in Diane's relationship with Moose. Diane relates how Moose was her constant companion and helped at her shop and training facility. He would greet and welcome, but then would make himself comfortable in an out of the way corner and watch over things. Diane was often there late and alone. One night 5 older teen-age boys dressed all in black came into her shop. They did not smile or talk and when they looked at her she said chills ran up her spine. She was truly terrified – until Moose almost knocked her over as he went past her in pursuit. They ran out the door with Moose closing in, but he stopped at the threshold. Diane has always wondered if he sensed something in them or just the fear in her. But after that he accompanied her whenever she felt there might be a problem. He could be seen in her truck enjoying the ride, but still on duty.

A quote from Diane: "The other stuff, the titles and all, he did for me. He wanted to work and make me happy. He truly enjoyed obedience. He was not precise, but always happy. He would celebrate clean finds at trials and hunt tests by throwing himself on the ground and rolling. I think that it must have been genetic because Judy Thompson talked about his grandmother "Gracie" rolling on her glove at tracking tests."

This dog was much more than statistical records (which alone make him worthy of the HOF) but was a best friend in true Weimaraner fashion.

“Flirt” is what the Weimaraner is supposed to be—versatile! She finished her CH from the puppy class with her first major at 7 months old and her second major as BOB over 15 specials at 8 months old. She was in the Top 10 during five years. Her first appearance on the top ten list was as an 8 month old puppy – her last appearance on the top ten list was as a veteran! Besides her BIS probably one of the most prestigious win was BISS at the Yankee Weimaraner Club specialty in conjunction with the largest National Specialty on record—from the Veteran Class as she made the last lap with the crowd on their feet applauding and yelling...it brought goose bumps as there was no holding back from anyone – this was a great Weimaraner taking a lap with so much side gait her breeder/handler said later “I needed a Flexi to keep up with her.” Her show record speaks for itself – in 2 years of specializing she had 47 Group placements with 12 Group Firsts, 132 Best of Breeds, and finished her career with 16 Specialty Awards. She had an Award of Merit at Westminster Kennel Club and three National Awards of Merit – including one from the Veteran Class.

Considering that she competed before the new plethora of titles, her versatility is very impressive. Flirt is the first BIS weimaraner to go BIS while holding an AKC hunting title. She finished her Junior Hunter (JH) in 4 straight qualifications before she was 12 months old—and also ran in the Field Futurity in conjunction with the National Field Trial – the scribe wrote “she had 5 bird finds but was hindered by her handler on foot!” – we were proud as she did a great job as a gentleman’s hunting dog! She qualified in four straight Companion Dog (CD) legs from the Novice B class with one 2nd place award. She completed her Novice Agility (NA) from All Breed Novice B classes with 3 placements – then three years later with no practice and as a Veteran, she won 1st Place at the Nationals in Agility Novice B. Her Tracking Dog (TD) was earned on her first try on the very difficult

Houston oil field course. Then, when the new title of Agility Jumpers With Weaves (NAJ) was available she quickly prepared and in three qualifications from All Breed Novice B classes again had three placements of two 1st and one 2nd – at nine years old! These titles – CD, TD, NA, NAJ – qualified her for the AKC versatility title of VCD1 – the second weimaraner in history to earn such a title – and still the only Best in Show Weimaraner to hold a VCD1. In addition, she has an NRD plus VX and a CGC. She is still the only Weimaraner with a Versatile Excellent to be an All Breed Best in Show winner. She also had two Dog World Awards.

As a producer, Flirt was a BROM and a Top Producer. Her first litter from CH BIS/BISS Adam von Arras produced 2 Champions of 5 puppies; her second litter from CH BISS Baht N Greywind’s Playn the Game JH, BROM, HOF produced 4 champions of 6 puppies. The year she won the BiSS at the YWC specialty at the Nationals, she was also TOP PRODUCING DAM for 1998 with 5 champions that year – 4 of the 5 were strictly owner handled to their Championship with the 5th being handled by the sire’s owner—and the 6th finished a month later in 1999 –again novice owner handled with three majors.

Flirt’s final days were spent as a constant companion to my grandson, Braden. He was born a quadriplegic – with no use of his hands, arms, legs, or feet. She would pick up toys and hold them to his mouth for him to play. She would snuggle beside him on the floor as a “prop” to keep him in a sitting position. She always placed herself between Braden and anyone she didn’t know. When he would be unable to turn over or right himself, she would wedge herself between him and the floor to give him a boost. All of these assists she did with little training.

It is a trip down memory lane when breeders talk about her ... it is always positive and touched with awe. She left a mark on many of us. She was, indeed, a great Weimaraner.

Jesse was a dog who brought style and run to the breed. In his career he was the top All Age/Gun Dog for five years, from 1997 – 2001. He accumulated 1,995 WCA points in 102 placements and won 12 championship 1-hour stakes. In 1998, he was the first dog in the breed to win all three broke dog stakes at the WCA Eastern Field Classic. He competed in both American Field and AKC events. Jesse was invited to the annual AKC Gun Dog Championship twice and was the first Weimaraner to place in this prestigious event.

Three elements coalesced to make this Field Champion. First was owner John Goldstein who recognized the promise of his dog and his duty to the sport to give his protégé every opportunity to reach his maximum potential. Second was trainer Scott Beyer who brought his charge along methodically to preserve the style and intensity that came to be this dog's trademark as well as the dog's absolute love of retrieving. Then there was Jesse, flowing as he moved like a fine race horse, devouring the ground beneath him regardless of the venue, Jesse was always intent on his mission which was to find birds. He was a bird-finding machine.

From the beginning, Phoebe was "Special." She started her show career with a bang the day she turned six months old, by going Best of Winners. Finishing her Championship quickly, she then went home to mature and to polish her hunting skills – qualifying at her very first Hunt Test.

Phoebe started her specials campaign in January, 1992 with her owner Ellen Grevatt as her handler. In June she was sent to handler Stanley Flowers, who campaigned her for the remainder of her show career. Together, they made Breed history.

On the way to that monumental achievement, she won 14 All-Breed Bests in Show, and over 10 Specialty Show Bests in Breed. In addition, she won an amazing 77 Group 1's – and 116 Group placements before she retired.

Not only was Phoebe a ground-breaker in her own right, she continued the Best in Show tradition by producing a Best in Show son – BIS and BISS CH. Greywind's Snow Cloud, JH, sired by multi-BIS CH. Greywind's High Flying Cloud, JH, TD, V, BROM.

Overall, Phoebe made a sea-change in the course of Weimaraner history. It was she who opened the door for Weimaraners who followed her to be acknowledged in the Sporting Group and the Best in Show ring. It was Phoebe who set the precedent for Weimaraners to be ever-after strong contenders for top honors in the show ring.

Schultz was an incredible individual! He was sweet, kind and one hell of a bird dog. He burst onto the field trial scene in 1994 by becoming the WCA's #1 All Age/Gun Dog with an amateur owner/trainer. Schultz earned this ranking while competing in the wide open spaces of the Southwest. He had the run, style and intensity to make him competitive with the all breed dogs, a trait not often seen in Weimaraners. Schultz won his last all breed stake at the age of eleven. His owner became a professional Weimaraner field trainer but Schultz won the WCA's National Amateur Field Championship handled by amateur Randy McKnight.

While Schultz's natural talents brought him to national prominence his greatest contribution was that as a sire. Bred to only 7 bitches in his lifetime he sired the following: 12 Field Champions, 2 Amateur Field Champions, 2 Dual Champions (plus one FC son needing only 2 single show points to be DC), 1 National Field Champion, 1 National Amateur Field Champion and 4 Field Futurity Winners.

His litters showed remarkable consistency. One litter took all 4 placements at the 1998 Western Field Futurity. Another litter produced 5 Field Champions, a record seldom matched in any breed.

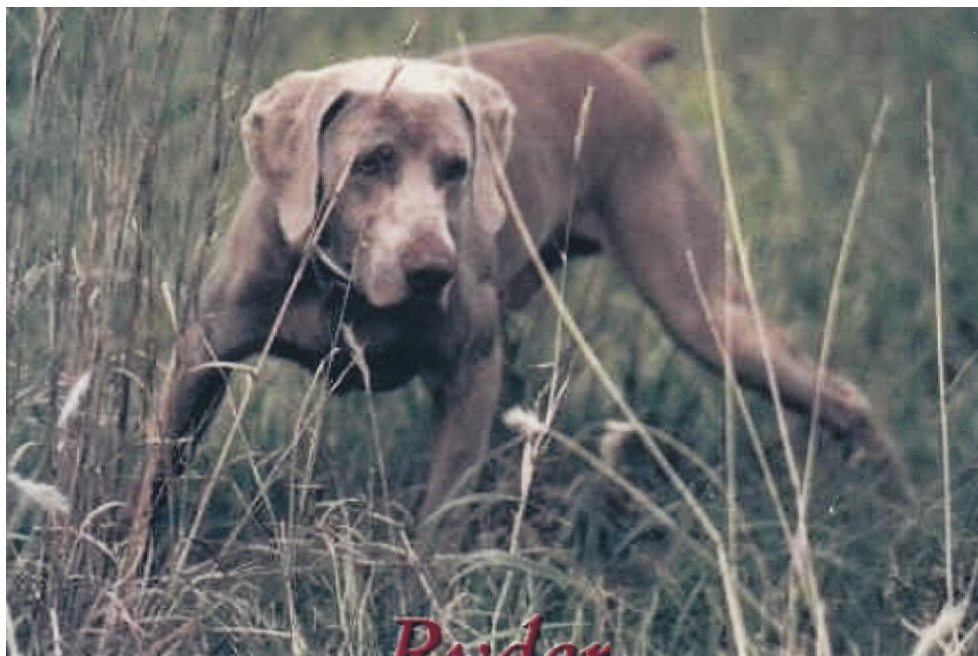

Consistently placing in all breed trials, he also placed at WCA Field Classics 11 times and 4 times at the WCA Field Nationals. His heart and desire made him a WCA Top Ten Gun Dog multiple times. Ryder passed his winning characteristics to his offspring who follow in his path to greatness.

It was apparent she was a special girl so she was given to Keith Pautz to show. Within a couple of months of handling she won BOB every day at a 4 day circuit and placed in the group 3 times. Within a month she had back to back Best in Shows and a Maturity win.

Those who were friends of Lily called her "The Princess." She was truly one of a kind. Keith tells of a time when she just refused to go into the Group ring because there were dogs with hair around her trying to enter the ring. She would consistently shy away from dogs with hair. He finally picked her up, took her into the ring and set her down and she went on to win the Group. Once in the ring she was in her element and did her thing. Another time she was up for Best in Show in San Antonio under Jean Fournier when Keith dropped the lead. He told Lily to "stand and step." She did it perfectly and when she was awarded Best in Show the judge said, "You should do that more often."

In her career she had back to back National Specialty wins, 2 back to back Best In Shows, 76 Group 1's and so many Group placements, Sweepstakes and Specialty wins that we have long since lost count. She made it to #3 Sporting Dog and #11 in the All-Breed standings. She broke all breed records by the time she retired. She retired in 1995 after securing a Group placement at Westminster and her 15th Best in Show. She produced 9 pups and five became champions, giving her her BROM.

Streak had a successful show career starting with a Specialty Major win his first time in the ring at 6 months of age and finished his Championship at 12 months of age with a large 5-point major during the Canfield, Ohio Specialty weekend. He was the Best-of-Opposite-Sex winner at the 2004 National Specialty at just 1½ years of age and went on to win the 2005 National Specialty and the 2006 Top Twenty Invitational. He was a Futurity and Maturity winner and was on the Top Ten list for three consecutive years. Streak enjoyed showing, especially his time ringside, where Chris spent their time waiting to go into the ring by teaching him new tricks. Streak's most important contribution to our breed, however, was as a Top Producer. He earned his BROM well before his 3rd birthday and was the Top Producing Sire in 2005 with 19 Champions and 2010 with 13 Champions. He has sired 72 champions to date and is the #3 All-Time Top Producing Sire (BROM points). He has the record of the most Best-In-Show offspring with five earning that distinction so far, as well as three offspring that have earned Best In Show world-wide. As a result of offspring sired by Streak, three Dams earned Top Producer awards in 2005, 2007 and 2010. Streak has also sired a National Best in Specialty Show Winner, two Top Twenty Invitational Winners, a #1 Top Ten Show Dog, multiple Top Ten Show Dogs, as well as seven Futurity and ten Maturity Winners. Streak also passed on his marvelous outgoing, trainable personality and has offspring with advanced performance titles including ones with Master Hunter and Master Agility titles, and also our breed's 8th Champion Tracker.

Mickey was the third son in the Paulsen family, the family gun dog, an all-breed competitive field dog, a show-pointed and obedience-titled versatile dog and the bedrock on which the majority of today's field dogs are founded.

Shirley and Mickey ran in their first field trial and won. Shirley was hooked. He was trialed and shown primarily in Colorado and the surrounding states. Most of his trial experience was in all breed trials, including American Field events. Although Mickey garnered points in the show ring, he lacked a final major to complete his bench championship. He was Colorado Dog of the Year in 1968. He was always owner trained and handled. In all his endeavors he always did the Weimaraner breed proud.

Along with successfully competing in obedience, retrieving, hunting and field trials, he was the family's consummate personal gun dog. Mickey was an extremely intelligent dog with a mischievous side. Some of his "tricks" included opening doors (but not closing them), turning on water faucets (but not turning them off), "sorting" the laundry and going through windows to be with his owner.

Old Mickey's genetic influence lives on in the top field dogs of the 21st century. Since 1981 of the 29 National Field Champions, 27 are his direct descendants. Of the 29 National Amateur Field Champions, 28 are Old Mickey's descendants. Five descendants are WCA Hall of Fame inductees. Over half of the WCA Field Register of Merit sires and dams are descendants. Truly a legendary feat of producing and reproducing quality bird dogs.

Ruby simply loved to work and she excelled equally in all competitive events however Ruby's true passion always remained real life hunting where she was an exceptional dog for both upland and waterfowl work. Ruby was a precocious workaholic earning many of her titles and accomplishments at a very young age and she remains at this time the most titled Weimaraner in the history of the breed with well over 50 titles to her credit, including Championships and advanced titles in every competitive discipline available to Weimaraners. Trained and handled by her owner, Shirley Nilsson, Ruby made Weimaraner history by becoming the first Weimaraner Triple Champion by earning AKC Show, Field and Obedience Championships. Some of her career competition highlights include numerous all-breed obedience High in Trial awards, winning the Western Classic Open Derby stake, placing 2nd in her Show Futurity class at the National Specialty show, winning a CKC Best Puppy in Sporting Group, placing 4th in the National Amateur Gun Dog Championship and earning a top score in obedience competition of 199.5/200. Ruby has also broken records as a producer, she is to date the only Weimaraner to have produced multiple AKC/CKC Champions in every competitive discipline available to Weimaraners: Conformation, Agility, Obedience, Tracking and Field and well as producing one record-breaking dog that earned AKC Championships in all five disciplines. Ruby's offspring also earned AKC Master Hunter titles and numerous titles in NAVHDA competition. Ruby is one of the very few Weimaraners to have earned both Field Register of Merit and Bench Register of Merit designations arising from the success of her offspring in Field and Show competition. Ruby's grandchildren are showing similar talent, she already has Show, Obedience, Agility, Field and Amateur Field Champion grandchildren to her credit as well as Master Hunter grandkids too.

Her ten offspring earned six Field Championships, an Amateur Field Championship and won the National Field Futurity and Open and Amateur National Field Championships.

She introduced countless people to the joys of hunting with Weimaraners through her appearance in six bird hunting shows for ESPN. Around the house she was never a 'Queen,' but ALWAYS a 'Princess,' slept in the bed, and greeted every new acquaintance as an old friend. Though her years with us flew by far too quickly, she lived her life with a happiness and joy that knew no bounds and not a day goes by that I do not think of her and miss her. Her legacy is not just the genetics she gave to the breed, but to the lifetime of wonderful memories she left to all who know and loved her.

In 1967 Gayle Eckenrode-Prescott, who was 18 at the time, was at the Weimaraner Club of the Washington DC Area's fall field trial where Ginny Alexander had a beautiful 8-week old puppy named Sprite. Ginny said, "Take the puppy home and if you can talk your parents into letting you keep her, she is yours", so the puppy went home with Gayle. Sprite was handled by Gayle to her show championship winning 4 majors including a 4pt. Major at the Pittsburg Specialty and a 5pt. Major at the Cleveland Specialty, along with two Best In Sweepstakes. At the 1968 Weimaraner Club of the Washington, DC Area Fall Field Trial, Sprite placed 2nd in Open Puppy with an entry of 13.

As impressive as Sprite's show record was, her accomplishments as a Top Producer speaks for itself. She was bred twice to Ch Seneca's Medicine Man, BROM which produced eight pups and once to Ch Halann's Banner v.d. Reiteralm producing only one pup.

- Sprite was #1 BROM Dam from 1977 thru 1991.
- Sprite was the first Weimaraner to produce 2 littermates who both won Best in Show, Ch Springdale's Rhea v.d. Reiteralm, CD and Ch Chataway's Charley v Reiteralm. This was not done again until 2011. These littermates also won the WCA National Specialty three years in a row, Charley in 1973 and Rhea in 1974 and 1975.
- Sprite's daughter Ch Springdale's Rhea v.d. Reiteralm, CD was the first Weimaraner bitch to win a Best in Show. She also won Best of Breed at Westminster three times.
- At the WCA National Specialty in 1974, Sprite's grandson, Ch Chataway's Rumor v.d. Reiteralm, BROM was Winners Dog, Best of Winners and Best Opposite Sex. Sprite's daughter Ch Chataway's Chelsea T, NSD was Winners Bitch and Sprite's daughter Ch Springdale's Rhea v.d. Reiteralm, CD was Best of Breed.
- Sprite's grandson Chataway's First Smoke, JH was the first Weimaraner to earn the new AKC title of Junior Hunter (JH).

Sprite was with Gayle for 14 years in which she made WCA history and left her mark on the breed. She was one remarkable dog.

After researching versatile hunting breeds, Bill decided the Weimaraner was the breed for him. Elena Smith picked out a pretty little puppy bitch which she believed would suit him. Bill named her Frieda and as a team they would go on to make history.

Bill enrolled Frieda in obedience classes and began showing her in conformation. Frieda finished her Breed Championship with four majors, including a five-point major from the Puppy Class. She also earned her Companion Dog title, but life changed when Frieda hit the bird field.

Bill was not raised in a hunting household, but the first time he saw Frieda hunt and strike a point he became a devoted participant in AKC Hunt Tests. Frieda was a very intense and stylish hunter and as a novice handler, Bill had his hands full. Frieda had drive in spades and she took the position that if she was in the field, no other dog was needed. Whenever her brace mate, usually a male dog twice her size, decided to rough Frieda up she would give it right back to him. The gallery would watch the big boys getting scolded soundly by little Frieda, who would zoom ahead to point the first bird, leaving them in the dust.

Training Frieda to hold through the retrieve in the Master Hunter stakes took a lot of convincing. Bill and Frieda eventually reached an understanding which enabled Frieda to earn her Master Hunter title. Frieda was the first Breed Champion bitch to earn a Master Hunter title.

At nine years old she earned her Novice Agility title including an All-Breed win which propelled her into a Top Ten Agility Dog. Frieda became the foundation bitch for Hallmar Weimaraners and produced nine puppies, four of which became Champions with numerous performance titles. Frieda's intelligence, intensity and drive continue to be found in generations of Hallmar dogs.

Her progeny include multiple breed champions with Best of Breed and Futurity winners as well as Group placements. In the performance venues, Frieda's offspring have earned titles in tracking, agility, retrieving and hunting tests, including a Champion/Master Hunter. In Obedience, accomplishments include a High in Trial and a Top Ten Obedience dog. Frieda lived to be fifteen and one-half years old, truly a grand dame!

Diva was driven in the field - unless pigeons were involved. She did not consider them "game birds". From the start she would not point pigeons and if they were wet she really despised them. During her novice retrieving test Diva did a flawless land retrieve - involving a quail. And then came the water retrieve... She willingly brought the pigeon to the shoreline, but then dropped it. When asked to pick it back up and bring it to me, she gave me that Weim look and then took it by a tip of a wing and literally flung it at me. Thank goodness the 'circle' wasn't too far away from the shoreline!

Diva had two litters sired by Ch. Nani's Indecent Exposure, JH, NAJ, V, BROM and found yet another area where she excelled. Of the twelve offspring a record setting ten finished their AKC Championship in one year, earning Diva the 2005 Top Producing Dam Award and making her the 6th generation of #1 Top Producers for Nani's Weimaraners. Several offspring finished their Championships with 5-point majors earned during Futurity/Maturity weekends and one went Winners Bitch at the 2005 National Specialty.

Her offspring include a BROM son who is an AKC Best-In-Show winner, a multiple Group/Specialty winner, a Top Ten Show Dog in 2007; the 2006 and 2008 Best-of-Opposite Sex winner at the WCA National Specialty. Another son who lives in Australia has earned multiple Best-In-Show awards, is an Australian Supreme Champion as well as an Australian dual Champion with a Tracking Championship. In total, Travelair produced 1 BISS, 5 CH's, 6 JH's 6 NRD's, 1 SH, 2 CD's, 1 RE, 1 CDX, 2 V's, 1 VX and one Top Twenty Show Dog with an Award of Merit at the WCA Nationals. Her grandchildren include a Best in Futurity, Best in Maturity and a Master Hunter.

She was what every breeder aspires to, versatility, temperament and longevity. Travelair was healthy to the very old age of 17 ½ years. On her 17th birthday, she was out in the bird field showing the youngsters how to do it!
